Matthew 10:10	Take no bag for the journey, or extra shirt, sandals, or a staff; the worker is worth his keep.	Bag (pēra) – traveler's bag; Worth (axios) – deserving, due value.	God's servants should live simply, relying on His provision through those they serve.	Live with contentment and let God supply needs through His people.
Matthew 10:11	Whatever town or village you enter, search for a worthy person and stay at their house until you leave.	Worthy (axios) – fitting, suitable, receptive.	Ministry flourishes where hospitality and openness to the gospel exist.	Seek and invest in receptive people who open doors for ministry.

Summary Revelation
