Jesus Sends Out the Twelve Apostles (continued)



Verse	Details	Keywords	Revelation	Application
Matthew 10:34	Jesus declares that He did not come to bring peace to the earth, but a sword.	Sword (machaira) – instrument of division, not violence; Peace (eirēnē) – harmony, reconciliation.	The message of Christ divides truth from falsehood and loyalty to Him from compromise.	Following Christ may cause division, but truth and allegiance to Him must come first.
Matthew 10:35	“For I have come to turn a man against his father, a daughter against her mother.”	Turn (dichazō) – to divide or separate sharply.	Jesus fulfills prophecy that loyalty to Him will divide even families.	Stand firm for Christ even when family or friends oppose your faith.
Matthew 10:36	“A man’s enemies will be the members of his own household.”	Enemies (echthros) – those hostile to one’s beliefs.	True discipleship may bring conflict with those closest to you.	Choose Christ over comfort—faithfulness matters more than approval.
Matthew 10:37	“Anyone who loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me.”	Worthy (axios) – deserving, fit for; Love (phileō) – affection, deep attachment.	Christ demands supreme love and loyalty above all relationships.	Make Jesus your highest priority and let love for Him shape all other loves.
Matthew 10:38	“Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me.”	Cross (stauros) – symbol of death, self-denial, suffering.	Following Christ requires self-sacrifice and daily surrender.	Embrace the cost of discipleship and carry your cross with perseverance.

Verse	Details	Keywords	Revelation	Application
Matthew 10:39	“Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it.”	Life (psychē) – soul, self, identity; Lose (apollymi) – to surrender or give up.	True life is found in surrender; clinging to self leads to spiritual loss.	Live surrendered—real life begins when you give it to Christ.
Matthew 10:40	“Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me.”	Welcome (dechomai) – receive with openness; Sent (apostellō) – commissioned by authority.	To receive Christ’s messengers is to receive Christ Himself.	Show hospitality and honor those who serve in God’s name.
Matthew 10:41	“Whoever welcomes a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward.”	Prophet – one who speaks for God; Reward (misthos) – recompense,	God rewards even the smallest acts of faith shown to His servants.	Support and bless those doing God’s work—your reward is shared in their mission.
Matthew 10:42	“If anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is my disciple, they will not lose their reward.”	Little ones – humble followers; Cup of cold water – simplest act of kindness.	God values even the smallest act done in His name; nothing goes unnoticed.	Serve with humility—every act of love done for Christ counts eternally.

Summary Revelation

Jesus closes His commission with both a warning and a promise: **following Him demands full devotion, even when it brings division and cost**, but it also brings **deep reward and divine recognition**.

True disciples **love Christ above all, carry their cross daily, and serve others with humility**—knowing that **every act of faithfulness, from bearing hardship to offering a cup of water, matters in eternity**.

Cross References

Matthew 10:34

“Do not suppose that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I did not come to bring peace, but a sword.”

- **Cross References**
 - Luke 12:51 – “Do you think I came to bring peace on earth? No, I tell you, but division.”
 - Hebrews 4:12 – “The word of God is sharper than any double-edged sword.”
 - John 7:43 – “Thus the people were divided because of Jesus.”
 - **Theme: Christ’s message divides**—truth always confronts sin and demands decision.
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Matthew 10:35

“For I have come to turn a man against his father, a daughter against her mother.”

- **Cross References**
 - Micah 7:6 – “A son dishonors his father, a daughter rises up against her mother.”
 - Luke 14:26 – “If anyone comes to me and does not hate father and mother... he cannot be my disciple.”
 - John 9:22 – The blind man’s parents fear the Jews for confessing Christ.
 - **Theme: Loyalty to Christ supersedes family ties**—discipleship brings relational cost.
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Matthew 10:36

“A man’s enemies will be the members of his own household.”

- **Cross References**
 - Psalm 41:9 – “Even my close friend, someone I trusted, has turned against me.”

- Matthew 24:10 – “Many will betray and hate each other.”
 - John 15:18–19 – “If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first.”
 - **Theme: Discipleship invites opposition**, even from those closest to you.
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Matthew 10:37

“Anyone who loves their father or mother more than me is not worthy of me.”

- **Cross References**
 - Deuteronomy 6:5 – “Love the Lord your God with all your heart.”
 - Luke 14:26–27 – True disciples must place Christ above family and self.
 - John 12:25 – “Anyone who loves their life will lose it.”
 - **Theme: Christ requires supreme devotion**—He must be loved above all others.
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Matthew 10:38

“Whoever does not take up their cross and follow me is not worthy of me.”

- **Cross References**
 - Luke 9:23 – “Take up your cross daily and follow me.”
 - Galatians 2:20 – “I have been crucified with Christ.”
 - 1 Peter 2:21 – “Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example.”
 - **Theme: True discipleship means self-denial, suffering, and surrender.**
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Matthew 10:39

“Whoever finds their life will lose it, and whoever loses their life for my sake will find it.”

- **Cross References**
 - John 12:25 – “Those who love their life will lose it.”
 - Philippians 3:8–9 – Paul counts all things loss for Christ.
 - Mark 8:35 – “Whoever loses their life for me and the gospel will save it.”
 - **Theme: Life’s paradox—gain comes through loss; self-denial leads to true life.**
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Matthew 10:40

“Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me, and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me.”

- **Cross References**
 - Luke 10:16 – “Whoever listens to you listens to me.”
 - John 13:20 – “Whoever accepts me accepts the one who sent me.”
 - 2 Corinthians 5:20 – “We are Christ’s ambassadors.”
 - **Theme: Receiving Christ’s messengers equals receiving Christ Himself.**
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Matthew 10:41

“Whoever welcomes a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward.”

- **Cross References**
 - 1 Kings 17:9–16 – The widow who provided for Elijah was blessed abundantly.
 - 2 Kings 4:8–10 – The Shunammite woman who hosted Elisha was rewarded with a son.
 - Hebrews 6:10 – “God will not forget your work and the love you have shown Him.”
 - **Theme: God honors those who support His servants.**
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Matthew 10:42

“If anyone gives even a cup of cold water to one of these little ones... they will certainly not lose their reward.”

- **Cross References**

- Mark 9:41 – “Anyone who gives you a cup of water in my name will not lose their reward.”
- Proverbs 19:17 – “Whoever is kind to the poor lends to the Lord.”
- Hebrews 13:2 – “Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers.”

- **Theme: God values every act of kindness done in His name**, no matter how small.
